Parent forms - please print and fill out one for each parent

Teacher forms – please print and have each individual teacher fill out one on your child (include teachers like karate instructor, piano teacher, etc... on children up to high school age)

ALL FORMS MUST BE RETURNED TO THE OFFICE

NO LATER THAN 3 (three) business days

BEFORE your child's appointment.

(ie; appointment is on Monday, the forms need to be in the office by the morning of the previous Wednesday)

If the forms are not returned 3 days before your child's appointment, the appointment will be cancelled and rescheduled to a later date. Should that happen, your child's prescription will not be refilled until they have their appointment.
